Our graduates take positions in a wide variety of nonprofit sectors, including arts, environment, human services, advocacy, animal welfare, etc. They take a variety of positions as well, with the most common being development directors, program officers, and development associates.

Most of our students have some existing experience in the nonprofit sector. For the few who don't (career-changers), we strongly recommend that the student complete at least one internship at a nonprofit as part of the Certificate coursework.
