Student Achievement

Alumni Survey (of 2016-2019 graduates): 80% of respondents were satisfied with the MCRP program

Community Planning Workshop Projects – Winter/Spring 2025:

- COASTAL HAZARDS AND PLACEMAKING FOR BANDON'S SOUTH JETTY (CITY OF BANDON): Investigates current conditions of Bandon's South Jetty and make recommendations to improve resilience to flooding hazards.
- BUSINESS OREGON TARGET INDUSTRY SECTOR ASSESSMENT (BUSINESS OREGON): Assesses and refines Oregon's target industry sectors for the next three-year period (2025-2028).
- OREGON HERITAGE RESILIENCE PLANNING (OREGON HERITAGE): Partners with the City of Albany, an Oregon Heritage All-Star Heritage Community, to create a Disaster Resilience Plan for Heritage Resources.
- MARION COUNTY EVACUATION PLANNING (MARION COUNTY): Assesses, evaluates, and develops multi-hazard evacuation plans for high hazard areas in the Santiam Canyon of Marion County.

Students in CPW are evaluated by instructors and external faculty reviewers in oral presentation, and visual skills.

- Presentation: Non-verbal, verbal, Organization, Content, Visual Aids, Q&A response. Average team scores: 75% Exemplary; 25% Proficient
- Visual: Clarity of Thinking, Content, Visual Style, Visual Communication, Writing/Audience: Average team scores: 50% Exemplary, 50% Proficient

Exit Survey Students are asked to self -evaluate on PAB knowledge, skills, and values. We chose a few indicators that align closely to our recently adopted Student Learning Outcomes (and 2022 PAB Standards.)
