APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION TO THE PPPM MAJOR

Students **must** apply to the PPPM major before earning 30 credits in PPPM major coursework. Students are encouraged to apply for admission in the term prior to achieving junior class standing (90-105 credits). The school encourages applicants who have demonstrated scholarly ability and who have some experience, either paid or volunteer, in public service. **Preference is given to applicants who have completed a majority of the university's core education group requirements and have an overall grade point average of 3.00 or higher.**

Prior to applying for admission to the major, students must take the following courses:

- Economics 201 Introduction to Economic Analysis: Microeconomics
- At least one of the following (passed with a letter grade of C- or higher): PPPM 201 Introduction to Public Policy, PPPM 205 Introduction to City Planning, PPPM 280 Introduction to the Nonprofit Sector

The school strongly encourages applications from individuals regardless of race, age, gender identity, sexual orientation, religion, or ability. We recognize that affirmative action and equal opportunity begin with the development of professionals who represent a diversity of ideas and cultures.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Submit the following materials:

- 1. The PPPM Application for Admission form, typed, completed, and signed.
- 2. Transcripts from all colleges and universities (unofficial transcripts are acceptable).
- 3. Brief résumé showing college-level education, employment, and volunteer history (avoid listing high school experience on résumé).
- 4. Personal statement describing your interest in public service, your career goals, and how the PPPM major will support your interests and help achieve your goals. <u>Limit your statement to two typed, double-spaced pages</u>.

Additional guidelines regarding the personal statement:

- Career Objectives: A statement regarding your career objectives is required within the personal statement. For example, explain the areas of public service where you might see yourself working. Your statement will be evaluated in terms of how well these objectives are presented and whether or not they are appropriate to the PPPM program.
- Communication Skills: Because communication skills are critical to a professional in public service, preference is given to applicants who can demonstrate these skills. For example, the career objectives statement is used to evaluate an applicant's writing ability and how effectively the applicant can communicate.

Applications are due no later than 5:00 p.m. on the Monday of week 4 during fall, winter, and spring terms. Admission to the major is effective the following term. Applications are not accepted summer term.

You are responsible for making sure all application materials reach the school prior to the application deadline. **Please** retain a copy of your application materials.
